


What is Neurodiversity?

Autism Spectrum Disorder



- Fosters a sense of value among all employees
- Has a positive effect on the workplace and the customer
- Generates the inherent social benefits of creating and sustaining an inclusive workplace

Job Posting

- Include clear instructions on how candidates can request an accommodation
- Use clear, plain language and remove jargon
- Only list basic requirements that are absolutely needed for the job
- Include company's support for employees, its values, and professional development opportunities
 - Volunteer opportunities
 - Employee benefits (flexible working policy, tuition reimbursement)
 - Disability employee resource group

Top Leadership

- Show support for recruiting, hiring, promoting, and retaining individuals with disabilities
 - Diversity statement
 - ERG
 - Targeted recruiting
 - Partnerships
- Ensure language that is spoken and written is inclusive and respectful
- Have policies and procedures in place that encourage inclusivity
 - Anti-harassment policy
 - Accommodation procedures
- Find and develop champions

- Considerations for interview process
 - Number of interviewers
 - Interview questions in advance
 - AskEARN Neurodiversity in the Workplace
- Assessing the job candidate
 - Focus on ability to do the job with or without an accommodation
- Job offer
 - Set clear expectations



Onboarding and Retention

- First day checklist
 - When to report to work
 - Breaks/lunch
 - Who to report to
 - What to expect
- Progress through probationary period
 - Positive feedback
 - Constructive criticism
- Training
- Performance coaching





Supporting Co-workers

- Interactions
- Documents
 - Easy to read fonts
 - Avoid red and green
 - Include visual elements when presenting data with numbers
 - Record meetings
- Work meetings/projects
 - Face-to-face
 - Online
- Outings
 - Celebrations
 - Lunch/dinner
