EEO Census Data + Internal Feeders = Affirmative Action Goals

- This is the yardstick by which you are measured
- Must be reasonable and attainable
- OFCCP issued a notice that the new data must be used for AAPs developed on or after 1/1/22

Eventually – job titles were assigned occupation codes.

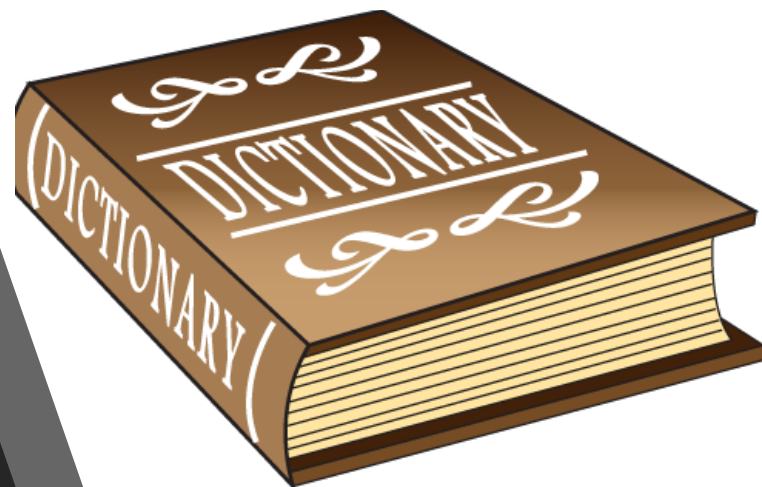

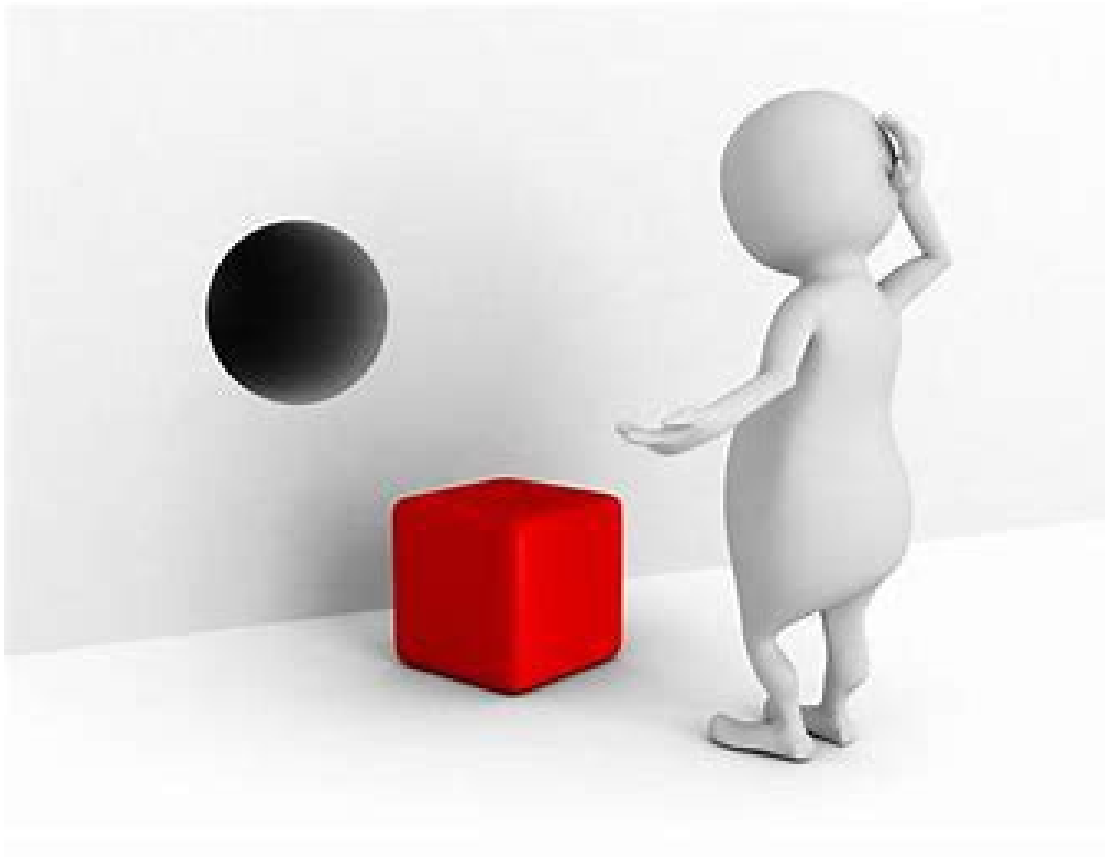

Occupation Codes vs Census Codes = Major Aggregation!



- **Those 579 Occupations codes have been aggregated into only 237 Census codes!**
- **In 2010 we have 535 Occupation codes in 488 Census Codes**

ACS Data: 2014-2018

- Implemented by Congress in 2005
- 5-year period-of-time
- Replaces the long form
- Sent to 3.5 million addresses each year
- Includes data on education, income, language proficiency, disability, citizenship, employment and housing
- Consortium who pays for census data includes:
 - Dept of Labor – OFCCP
 - EEOC
 - Dept of Justice
 - Office of Personnel Mgmt and Budgets

Who managed the data aggregation?

- Occupation Index is managed by census bureau staff in Jeffersonville, IN
- Type in what is written by respondent and try to find a match

What were they asked to do with the EEO Tables?

- Collect data from 2014 to 2018 per two Agreements with Sponsors:
 - Publish the tables
 - Publish the “pretty” search tool

Where is the data available?

- www2.census.gov: Data Warehouse - Not User Friendly
- www.census.gov/acs/www/data/eeo-data/eeo-tables-2018/

When was it decided to aggregate the data?

- Long before 2016!!

Why was the data aggregated?

- Cost of space on the server
- Privacy concerns
- Census Bureau gets sued a lot (not over EEO Tables)
- Lack of staffing
- Lack of details from respondents: ie: said Teacher – but not what kind of teacher

Only remap EEO/AA data every 8 to 10 years

- Remapped in 2013 (3 digits to 4)
- Remap in 2021- Leading zeroes are gone in Excel



- Currently using 2006 to 2010 ACS Data
 - That covered 154 Million people (154,037,475)
 - Included 1.6 Million unemployed
 - Released for use in 2013
- “New” tables cover 2014 to 2018
 - Covers 162 Million people (162,248,197)
 - Includes 1.9 Million unemployed
 - Released Feb 8, 2021
- Next Occupation Index due 2028
 - Next EEO Tables will be out in 2031

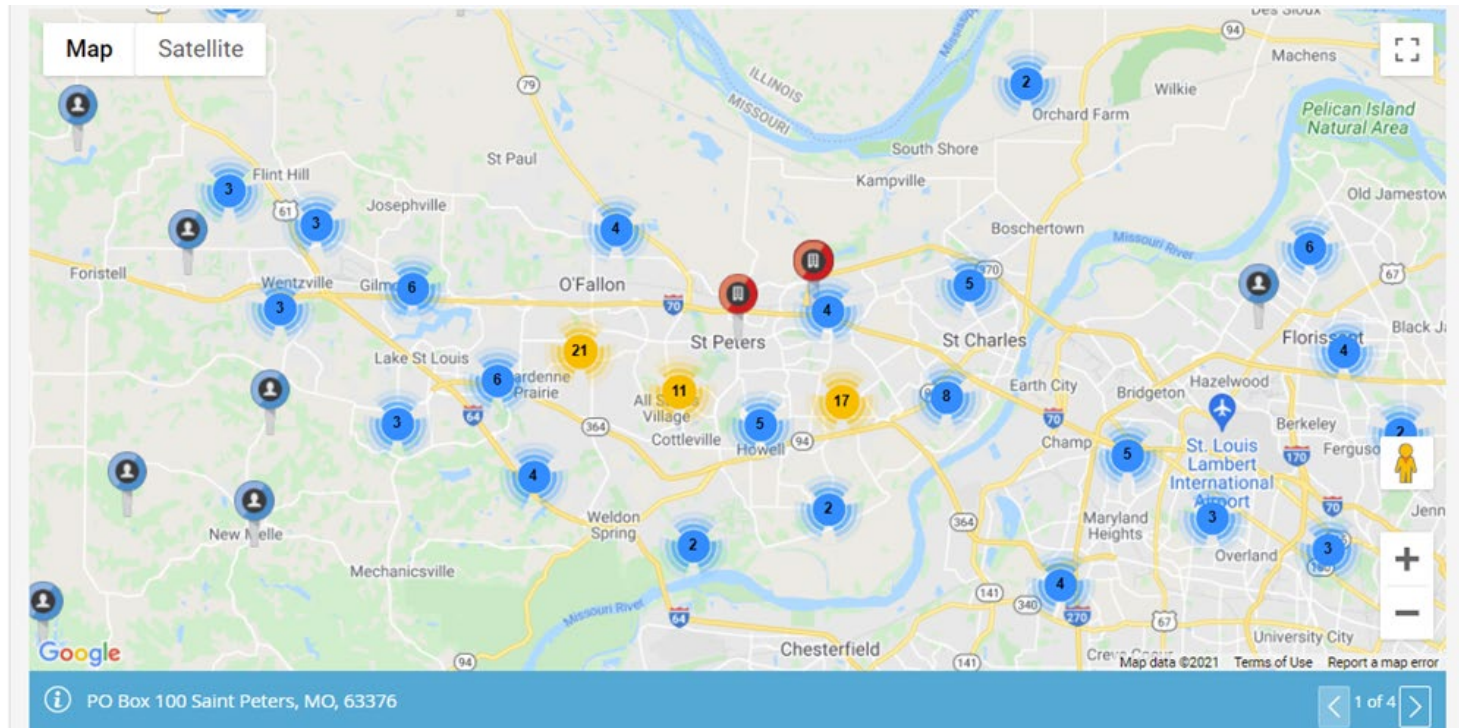

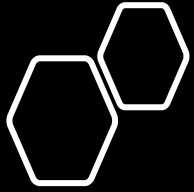

The Census Bureau identified a processing error in the 2014-2018 EEO Tabulation, which resulted in a re-run to add additional geographies. This decision was based on feedback from EEO consortium members, EEO data users and a review of the original geographic population thresholds applied. We inadvertently suppressed counties and CBSAs with a resident population of less than 50,000 for Table Sets 3 through 7. Additionally, based on feedback from EEO data users and Department of Labor Office of Federal Contract Compliance Programs (DOL-OFCCP), the Census Bureau will add additional tables for Table Set 1 under the label “Collapsed.” These collapsed tables will provide percentages only for suppressed counties and CBSAs not available in Table Set 1.

Data users should be aware that Census Bureau staff are re-running these table sets and will add back additional geographies to the FTP site and the EEO Table Tool. We will also add updates to the EEO Tabulation topic page on the Census Bureau website. This process is expected to take several weeks, and the new tables will be uploaded to the FTP site first, followed by the EEO Table Tool. This note will be updated to reflect this action. Things that make you say - What?

- Taney County, MO: 170 Financial Managers (0120) are all females
- In Green Bay, WI: Only 10 Chemists (1720), all white males, margin of error is 68.8%
- Columbia, MO: First Line Supvs Construction, 350 people including 27.1% females and 37.1% minorities (Had 460 people with zero females and zero minorities in 2010.)
- Richmond, VA Suppressed: Used Westmoreland and Nearby Counties- Financial Analysts (0840) 110 people – all females

- Not unusual to see numbers go up or down by 20 to 30%
- Not unusual to see “no data available”
- Lots of rounding!!
- Some industry data is fine; some is useless



What if you don't like the data?

- Go back to the job description – can you use another code?
- Can you combine some codes:
 - Sales Reps + Construction Equipment Operators
- Always look at the history of promotions – preferably 3 years
- Can you put more weight on internal feeders?
- Do you recruit from colleges and universities – use IPEDS
- Can you use Industry data by EEO Category – use EEOC data
- Scientific Jobs – National Science Foundation



How does all of this
impact HR & DEI?

Questions I ask my HR/AAP Clients

- **Where do your employees live?**
 - Metro and County - Set Definitions have changed
 - For AAP - Need to cover 90% of where your employees live - not the outliers
 - Run list of employees by county
- **Send me a Job Description**
 - Codes have been aggregated
 - May want to use a different skill code
- **What % of jobs are filled internally, locally, state-wide or nationally?**
 - Should be asking for each Job Group separately
 - May want to expand recruiting areas or use more internal data
- **Which jobs are always filled within the company?**
 - May not want to use any external data for those –
 - Don't need external if you can prove you never fill externally
- **What are the feeder jobs?**
 - Maybe that data is more realistic
 - Ideally, should be tracking three-year history of how jobs are filled

Questions for DEI Benchmarking

- Are you setting benchmarks nationally or by establishment?
- What level are your benchmarks:
 - The Board of Directors
 - Corporate Executives
 - Senior Managers
 - Managers
 - Non-Managers
 - All Employees
- Are you setting benchmarks by skill-set: IT vs Finance?
- Are you measuring the top 20% of your earners by gender & race/ethnicity?
- Are you setting overall benchmarks for minorities, or by race/ethnicity?
- Are you comparing your company to others by industry?

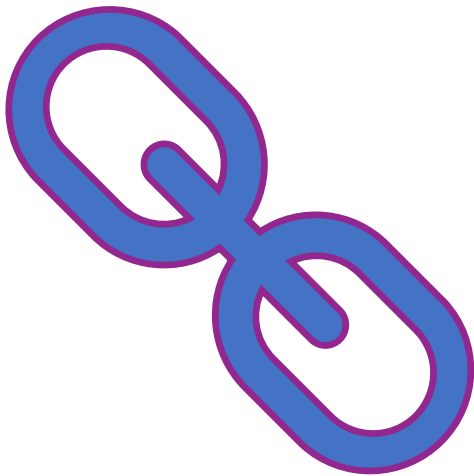
